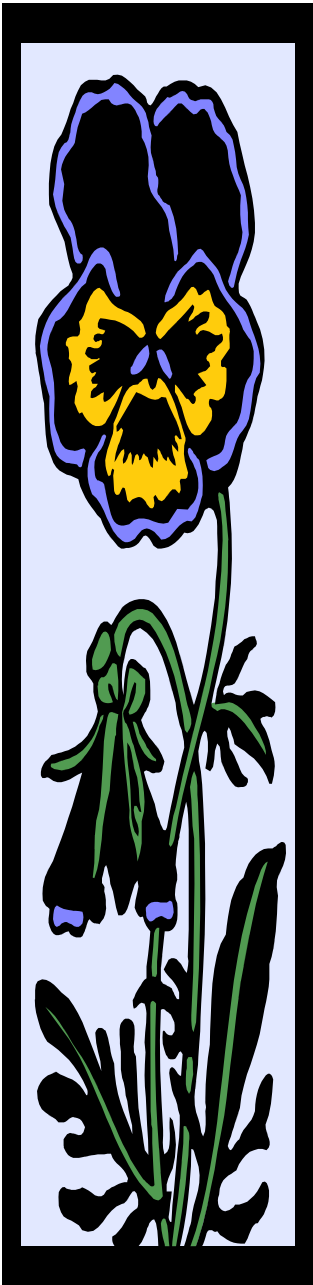

HOW DRY WE ARE, HOW DRY WE'LL BE!

We are still in a deficit situation for rain and most municipalities have instituted mandatory water restrictions. For areas that are prone to experience drought as we have this year, there are solutions to prevent your landscape investment from declining or dying from too little water. The following tips on being "water wise" may help.

- Adjust irrigation to make sure the spray pattern reaches plants and not the hardscapes in your yard.
- Run the system early in the morning to delay evaporation.
- Add drip irrigation around shrubs and trees for deep, direct water application.
- Install drought-tolerant plants. Give our office a call and we'll be happy to provide a list of drought-tolerant plants to consider.

FALL CHORES

- ⇒ Inspect plants and lawn for pest problems.
- ⇒ Prune evergreens to a neat, even shape.
- ⇒ Plant fall color beds.
- ⇒ Install fresh mulch if yours has discolored or is less than 3" thick..
- ⇒ Consider having a pond leaf net put over your water feature to keep the leaves out..
- ⇒ Make arrangements to have your irrigation winterized-call us today and get on the schedule early!
- ⇒ Make sure to remove leaves from your turf areas as soon as possible to prevent killing newly germinated grass plants.
